## DISCOVER

The course began in 1970 and has been instrumental in the training and placement of many Canadian broadcasters. This is the most in-depth television course in Ontario taught by teachers with years of TV and media industry experience to give you the real-world learning you are looking for!

In a facility unrivalled anywhere in an Ontario secondary school environment, you can begin your journey in Grade nine by taking integrated technology, where you can explore several technology-related pathways.

Grade 10 will offer you a variety of Communication Technology courses. These junior-level courses help students prepare for the television and multimedia programs which begin in grade eleven.

## CREATE

The television program at Stephen Leacock offers students a unique opportunity to develop high-end skills that can lead to careers in broadcasting and related communications industries. These courses are primarily aimed at those students wishing to get a head-start before attending post secondary institutions offering radio and television broadcasting, multimedia or film courses.

Both our Television and Multimedia courses place a high importance on your future post secondary training in either college or university. Beginning in grade eleven, students are rigorously prepared for a post-secondary career. Many of our graduates who go on to Ryerson, Seneca, York, Humber or Centennial have reported that their training at Leacock helps them to have a successful post-secondary career.



This year we have added two new cameras, a Sony HVR A1U and a Canon 7D for shooting full frame HD. We are also expanding our audio production capabilities with the addition of a Alesis Master Control audio surface and a internet radio station to broadcast Radio Leacock 24 hours a day.

\*If available (may not be offered in all semesters).

\*\* The Dual Credit program that runs in conjunction with a suitable course from Centennial College's Radio/Television Arts Program enables a student to earn a college credit towards a diploma in Radio & Television Arts. The student may use this credit or transfer it to another institution at the appropriate time.

## HOW DO I APPLY?

If you are a student currently enrolled in the Toronto District School Board you are eligible to join the TV/Multimedia program anytime by simply talking with your guidance counsellor. Although our course starts in grade 11, you can join the school starting in grade 9 if you wish to pursue a *specialized program pathway*.

Our grade 12 Advanced TV program begins on February 2, 2012 (although availability for this class may be limited and admittance is only available at the discretion of the instructor). You must first contact your guidance department in your home school and tell them you are interested in taking the TV production course at Stephen Leacock.



If you are currently in grade eight and are interested in the *Specialized Program Pathway*, our deadline for applications is January 9, 2012. Grade 9 applications are also available by contacting our guidance department at 416 396-8000. Admission is by interview, which will tentatively take place on January 12th, 2012.
